German Education Includes Five Potential Levels ****Many different Paths to follow based on students' goals and abilities**			
Elementary (aka Kita)	Grades (Pre-K) Grades (Kinder)	Ages (0-3) Ages (3-6)	Popular among population but is not mandatory Helps expose to regular contact with peers at an early age
Primary (aka Grundschule)	Grades (1-4)	Ages (6-9)	 Mandatory for all children Learn to read, write, and count in German English is also included in curriculum
Secondary (aka Hauptschule) (aka Realschule)	Grades (5-9) Grades (5-10)	Ages (10-14) Ages (10-15)	Several types of schools depending on students' goals and abilities. schools aim at a general education with practical courses, which qualify successful graduates for starting an apprenticeship or vocational training
Academic Secondary School (aka Gynaisum)	(Grades 5-12) (Grades 5-13)	Ages (10-17) Ages (10-18)	Requires higher grades for acceptance Emphasis on academic learning and achievement Allows application to university degree course
Tertiary Education (University)	Grades (12+)	Ages (17+)	Popular for reasons such as interest in subject, university experience, hope for better job Numbers growing in recent years Considered Affordable (many state funded or no fees at all)
